From the artsy streetscapes of Providence, Rhode Island, to the serene landscapes of Norway and the Indigenous culture of Santa Fe, New Mexico, here are 12 of the best destinations to visit in August.

Providence, Rhode Island

Providence bursts with life in summer, its walkable artsy downtown brimming with activities.

The pinnacle of summer attractions is WaterFire, an extraordinary art installation by local artist and Brown University graduate Barnaby Evans. Occurring several times over the summer, with an event on Aug. 19, WaterFire draws hundreds of thousands visitors annually.

Tahiti

Chicago

Adding to the allure are performances that include a fashion show, music, dance, storytelling and comedy. The Santa Fe Indian Market brings Native art, culture and heritage to life in a vibrant, festive atmosphere, making August an ideal time to explore this unique city.
