Dam engineer Robin Charlwood will talk about dam safety and parallels with airplane safety

Robin was generously offered a job at Boeing in 1968 on the SST project but declined and instead went into the field of water resources and hydroelectricity and has worked on life extension and safety of dams on all six non-Arctic continents for the last 50 years. He will talk about some key events and comparisons with the aerospace industry approaches to safety.

Robin will give a quick dam engineering 101 to illustrate the wide variety of designs used around the world and some basic criteria. These days it is accepted that dams have to operate safely for hundreds of years. Each one is different to conform with the natural site conditions. He will review some major historical international dam failures and identify the causes and then describe the recent evolution of dam safety requirements and methodologies in the US. Service life extension and sustainability of dams is increasingly important nowadays and he will discuss some of the deterioration mechanisms and management strategies being applied.
