At that meeting, Brian Nield will lead us through the investigation made into the crash of a 777 at Heathrow Airport January 17, 2008. After an uneventful trans-Siberian flight from China, a Boeing 777 crashed short of the runway at London Heathrow Airport. What could have brought down a state-of-the-art airplane such as the 777 in the final moments of its flight? This lecture will analyze the events of that day and open a window into the fascinating investigation that followed. The conclusions surprised the aviation industry and created ramifications for years to come.
