About the Series: National Geographic Live returns to Benaroya Hall! Hear behind-the-scenes stories straight from National Geographic's photographers, scientists, filmmakers, and adventurers live on stage, accompanied by iconic National Geographic footage and unforgettable imagery.

Conservation ecologist **Dr. Rae Wynn-Grant** works in the expansive American Prairie Reserve to protect and restore iconic wildlife populations, including North American black and grizzly bears, in a region once known for its great number of wild animals.

Dr. Rae Wynn-Grant is dedicated to wildlife ecology research, but it wasn't until life brought her to Kenya at age 20 that she had ever taken a hike, pitched a tent to camp, or seen a wild animal. While there, she studied East African lions—top carnivores that live in close quarters with local communities—and observed that problematic interactions between the two groups threatened conservation efforts. Now, **Dr. Wynn-Grant** is finding similar patterns for North American black and grizzly bears.

Join us at Benaroya Hall with this committed carnivore ecologist for a fascinating look inside the secret lives of bears and a report from the front lines of the mission to help humans and carnivores coexist peacefully.
