Mentoring with Washington State University

For our BLN-R members who are interested in Mentoring, this is your opportunity to Mentor the next generation of professionals.

We are working with Washington State University (WSU) to form a partnership to Mentor underrepresented minorities (URMs) and women in Sciences, Technology, Engineering, Math (STEM) and Pre-Health disciplines. Nationally, URM students (African Americans, Native Americans, Pacific Islander, Latino) who initially pursue STEM degrees are about 40 percent less likely to complete them compared with their White and Asian-American counterparts.

WSU established the Team Mentoring Program (TMP) in 2007 to focus on URM and women students. It is designed to maximize their experience in pursuing Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM), and Pre-Health disciplines in order to increase their retention, achievement and graduation.
